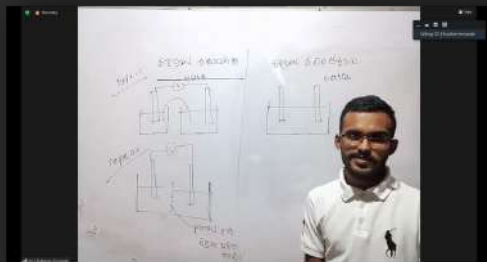

Given the country's current situation, the latest phase of Nena Aruna was launched aimed at AVL students. In the near future, we hope to launch a new phase to improve basic programming and graphic design skills within after-school students.



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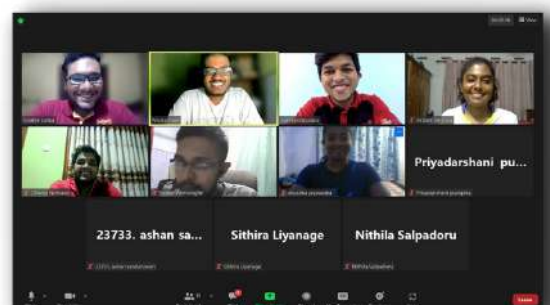

This year under this initiative, a series of training sessions for the disabled community was organized in collaboration with the organizations Enable Lanka and Big Hearts in the hopes of increasing their employability by improving skills that are thought to be useful in their daily lives such as Basic English, Social Skills, and Business Etiquette. The project is an important component of the Microsoft Enabler and will last six months, with monthly evaluations of the candidates' progress.

We had an amazing group of volunteers from the club who helped teach English to the candidates, and plans are in the works to continue the journey with many new additional training adjustments.

As the first step in the journey, we updated the project's official website to accommodate plans to investigate online donation methods as and when they need to be used.

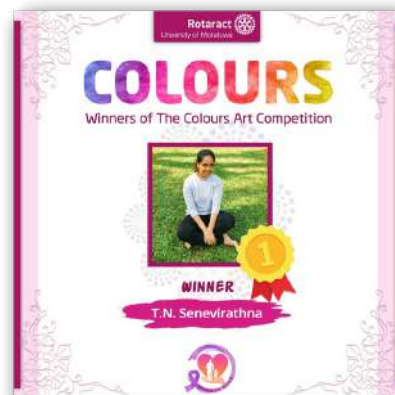

Zooxanthellae embarked on yet another year of exploration in 2021, following the enormous success of its first chapter in 2018. Zooxanthellae 2021-22 is collaborating with Mitsubishi Corporation as the Exclusive Strategic Partner. This year, the project kicked off with an awareness video series about the world's unsung heroes: coral reefs. By sharing awareness on social media, we hope to instil in Rotaractors a sense of the importance of coral reefs and inspire them to take action to protect them. Throughout the last three months, the organizing committee worked to collaborate with construction firms and other government organizations such as the Marine Environment Protection Authority, Sri Lanka Navy, and the Department of Wildlife Conservation in order to do coral restoration with concrete structures. The plan is to carry out three deployments, each depositing 60+ concrete structures in different locations in the sea beds. We hope to carry out the very first deployment in Nilwale during the month of November.

The program intends to enhance the living standards and overall well being of such students and lend a hand to minimize the barrier of financial burdens that stand between them and achieving their life dreams and goals.

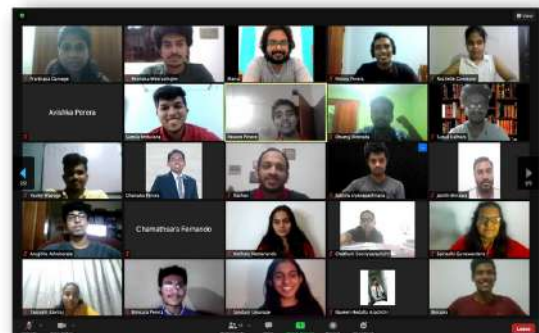

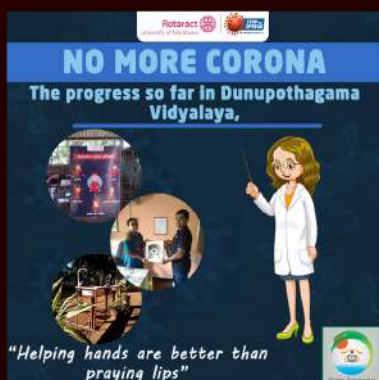
NO MORE CORONA

Both hospitals provide exceptional service to patients under the care of sympathetic staff members and in well-maintained hospital premises that provide relief to the community.

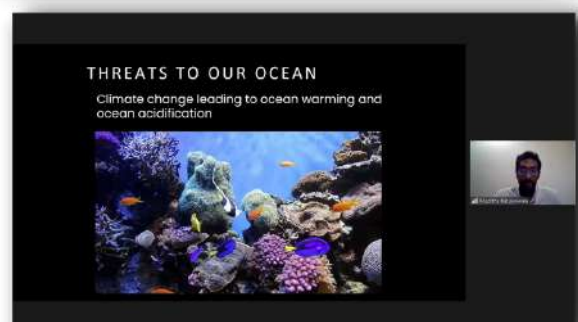


PEARL PACIFY

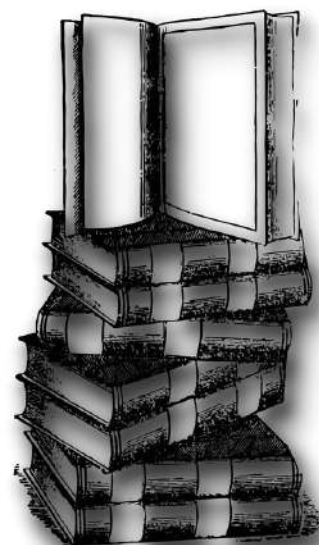


'LUMOS'

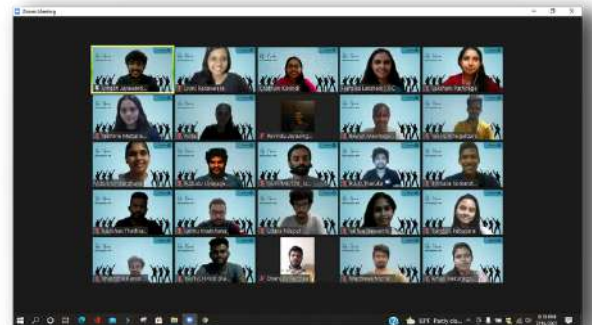
ROTA-NOVATOS

DISTRICT/JOINT PROJECTS

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(UNDER "TOGETHER SL" DISTRICT INITIATIVE)

"Together SL" was initiated by Rotaract District 3220, mainly focusing on developing communities, especially in rural areas. This year, Rotaract Club of University of Moratuwa was allocated to Team 05 of the initiative along with 12 other fellow Rotaract clubs by the District Regional Engagement team.

This time the project is focusing on addressing the pressing issue of insufficient chemical fertilizer and the absence of an appropriate market for organic fertilizers at the Grama Niladhari Division of 'Ihala Bopitiya' in the Pelmadulla Divisional Secretariat, located nearly 24km away from the city of Ratnapura. Roughly 1,000 residential families whose major livelihood has been identified as farming, are currently living in the village.



ESTUARY

'Estuary,' which tackles the critical issue of ocean pollution while also protecting coral reefs, will pave the way for the safeguarded future of marine life in the coastal belt around Sri Lanka.

Estuary will unfurl at an utmost of two phases. The first phase, entitled "Clean SL", tends to keep garbage from polluting watersheds and ultimately flowing into the ocean, while regrowth of coral reefs by installing permanent structures in the ocean will be tackled under the second phase, "Zooxanthellae."

a)CLEAN SL

Clean SL is an initiative that focuses on preventing mismanaged waste from entering waterways and eventually flowing into the ocean. Clean SL began its journey in the year 2021/22 with the goal of implementing proper waste segregation, reducing mismanaged plastic waste, and minimizing plastic waste released into the environment, which threatens small bodies of water and eventually reaches the ocean.
