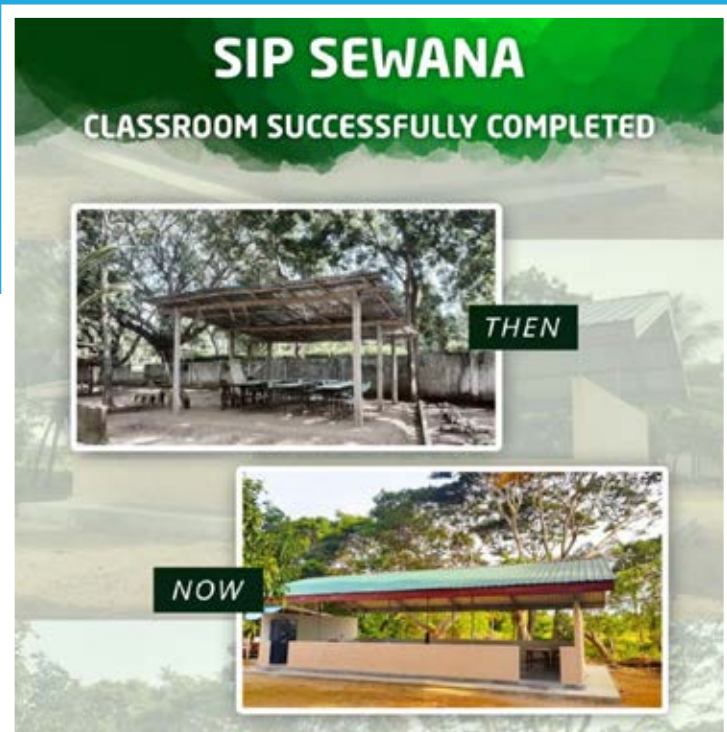

“Grama Prabodhaya” is the award-winning signature project of the Community Services avenue of Rotaract Mora. This is an enormous effort of Rotaract Mora to develop Dunupothagama village in the Anuradhapura district. It is not just a community service project with the concept of material donation, but a collective commitment to developing a village in many aspects to uplift the quality of life of the villagers. In this year’s installment of “Grama Prabodhaya”, the community services team hopes to address the pressing problem of brackish water and the need for filtered water in Dunupothagama. As the first step organizers plan to test sample water around the village to provide the best and most viable solution for the people in the village.

(a) Sip Sewana - Rainbow of Hope | 2019 - 30th September 2020

“Sip Sewana” is a subproject of “Grama Prabodhaya” under which a new classroom was built for the A/L students at Dunupothagama Vidyalaya. The classroom is now available for the use of the students, thus fulfilling the dreams of many who strived to make it a reality.

(b) Digitalize | Ongoing

“Digitalize” is a subproject conducted under “Grama Prabodhaya” with the aims of bridging the digital gap in Dunupothagama by providing a fully-facilitated ICT laboratory to Dunupothagama Vidyalaya. The school provides ICT as a basket subject to G.C.E. O/L students. Still, it lacks the relevant facilities (as in computers, computer tables, proper air conditioning systems, network connections, and more) to teach ICT. “Digitalize” is a novel initiative undertaken by Rotaract Mora, which promises to provide said facilities to the well-deserving students of Dunupothagama Vidyalaya.

As part of the project’s first phase, interested volunteers were asked to join in producing audiobooks of G.C.E. Ordinary Level and Advanced Level examination past papers. Thus, **260** such recordings have been completed under this project phase up until now.

We also successfully handed over the audiobooks based on G.C.E O/L & A/L examination past papers and marking schemes to The School for Deaf and Blind in Ratmalana.

a) **Andurata Athwalak | Ongoing**

This is hoped to be achieved by providing them with recordings of everyday conversations conducted in English.

Under the first phase of the project, content writing was completed with the energetic participation of volunteers and the written content is soon to be given a voice and brought to life under the project’s second phase.

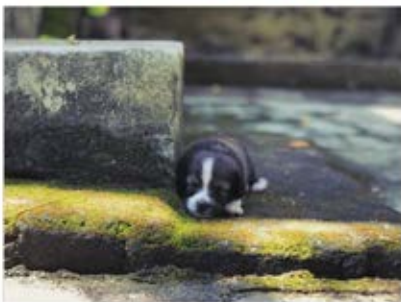

The aspiration was to provide the talented youth of Sri Lanka with an opportunity to showcase their skills in leadership, problem-solving, and entrepreneurship by applying their actuarial skills to a real-world problem, as well as providing them with the necessary exposure to the industry and the corporate world. The team-based competition revolved around a case study of a proxy company based on which competitors faced several competition rounds that evaluated the extent of the aforementioned capabilities within them.

After being evaluated by an esteemed panel of judges in the field, out of 36 submissions, 15 competing teams got qualified for the semi-finals, which was held on the 11th of September 2020. The pre-Grand Finale case cracking session was held on the 24th of September while the Grand Finale of ‘MAESTRO 2020’ was magnificently held on the 30th of September 2020, with 5 finalists competing for the Grand Prize.

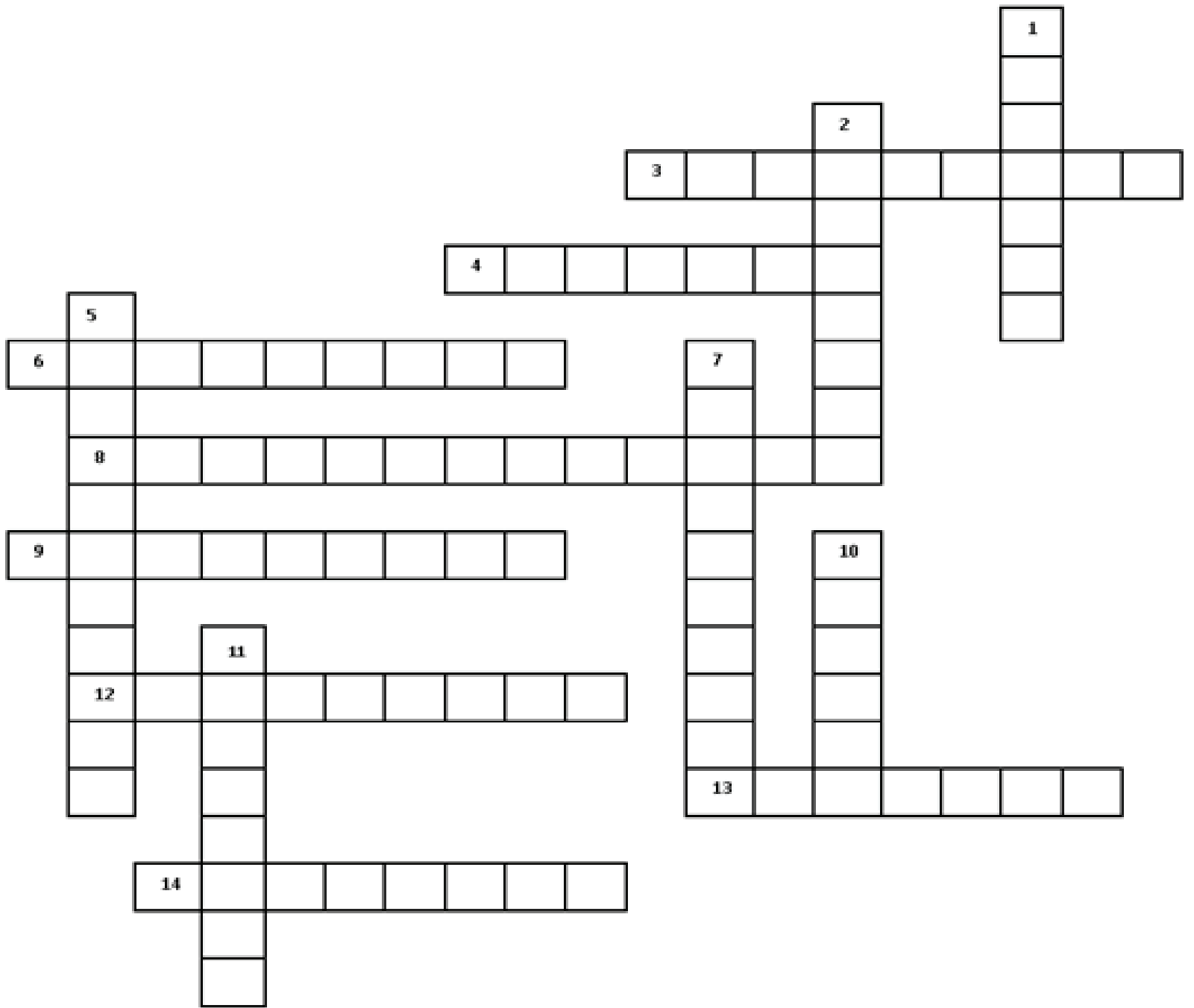
